Dear Youth and Young Adults of Brooklyn and Queens,

As I recall the wonderful memories of World Youth Day in Lisbon last August, I would like to remind you that Pope Francis called on all the young people present in the crowd gathered at the Parque Tejo to come together again in Rome in 2025 for the Jubilee of Young People. Just as the Holy Father said, "I'm giving you an invitation", I too invite youth and young adults in our diocese on this special pilgrimage to celebrate the **Youth Jubilee** in Rome next summer!

Our pilgrimage will begin in Assisi, where the holy lives of St. Francis and St. Clare are rooted. We will venerate the relics of Blessed Carlo Acutis, the young Catholic from Italy who had a passionate devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Our itinerary in Rome will follow a rhythm similar to World Youth Day. We will walk through the Holy Doors of the four Papal Basilicas to receive a plenary indulgence

Our time together will conclude with an overnight Vigil and special Youth Jubilee Mass with the Holy Father. Together, let us set out as pilgrims of hope, asking the Blessed Virgin Mary to accompany our journey of preparation for the grace-filled event of the Jubilee 2025.

YOUTH JUBILEE 2025 ITINERARY - Unexpected circumstances may cause changes to the outlined itinerary.

DAY 1 Sunday, July 27: Depart for Italy

Depart New York's JFK International Airport for our overnight flight to Rome, Italy. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the transatlantic flight.

DAY 2 Monday, July 28: Welcome to Rome! | Assisi

Arrive at Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way Tour Manager as we exit from Customs and Baggage Claim. Board our private touring bus and we'll be on our way to Assisi (2.5-hour drive). Upon arrival we'll visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great basilica built in 1569 and crowned by Alessi's magnificent dome. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered; the place where Clare received the habit from Francis; and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where the Saint died. We will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Santa Maria degli Angeli.** After Mass, check-in at our hotel in Assisi. This afternoon, we'll also have the opportunity to visit the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore, housing the Tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Assisi. (B,D)

DAY 3 Tuesday, July 29: Sites of St. Francis and St. Clare | Rome

Breakfast at our hotel. **Begin our day with Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis.** After Mass, our local guide will take us to explore the basilica complex, which is composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower basilica dates from 1228 to 1230 and is richly decorated with beautiful stained-glass windows and paintings by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper basilica, built from 1230 to 1253, we will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the saint. Continue to visit the Basilica of St. Clare, the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement. View her remains and see the miraculous crucifix. Group lunch in Assisi. After lunch, we'll hike or take taxis to Eremo delle Carceri, a hermitage complex on the slopes of Mt. Subasio. The core of the hermitage is the actual rock cave where Francis would often withdraw for prayer and contemplation. See St. Francis's cave and the original oratory, as well as the oak tree near a stone bridge where St. Francis preached his sermon to the birds. Return to Assisi late afternoon. Early evening, we'll continue to Rome, the "Eternal City." We'll see 2,500 years of history, from Roman ruins to 15th century churches, 17th century palaces, and 20th century monuments. Stop for independent dinner en route. Check-in at our hotel upon arrival in Rome. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,L)

DAY 4 Wednesday, July 30: Jubilee for Young People

Early breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll participate in the **Jubilee for Young People** (program to be advised). Independent lunch. After lunch, we'll go on a walking tour and experience the best of ancient Rome. Begin at the Pantheon. Built more than 1,800 years ago, the magnificent Pantheon still stands as a reminder of the great Roman Empire. The name Pantheon refers to the building's original function as a temple for the gods. When approaching the front of the Pantheon we can still see the original Latin dedication by Marcus Agrippa. Continue to the Church of San Luigi dei Francesi to see the stunning interior, which is home to a trio of Caravaggio masterpieces. Then we'll walk to the Trevi Fountain and Piazza di Spagna, one of the most famous squares in Rome. See the Fontanna della Barcaccia (Fountain of the Old Boat) in the middle of the piazza and enjoy the view from the famous Spanish Steps. **Celebrate Mass at the Church of Sant'Agnese in Agone** in Piazza Navona. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

DAY 5 Thursday, July 31: Jubilee for Young People | Holy Doors of Rome*

Early breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll participate in the **Jubilee for Young People** (program to be advised). *The main distinction of the Papal Basilicas is that they each have a special "holy door" which are opened only during Jubilee years. Throughout the days of the Jubilee our group will assigned scheduled time (to be advised) to visit and pass through the Holy Doors of the following Papal Basilicas:

- **St. Peter's Basilica** welcomes all who come to Rome! Obtain the Jubilee indulgence and encounter Christ, the "door" who unites us with the Father. The door is always open to those who convert their lives.
- **Basilica of St. Mary Major**, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (432-440 A.D.). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics depicting scenes from the Old Testament. View relics of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem and the high altar, which contains the remains of St. Matthew the Evangelist. View the icon Salus Populi Romani, Protectress of the Roman People, believed to be painted by St. Luke. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome.

- **Cathedral of St. John Lateran**, the first Christian church to be consecrated. It was founded by the Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and was home to the Popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. From there we will go to Sanctuary of the Passion of Christ which in under the care of the Passionists. According to Christian tradition, St. Helena, the mother of Constantine, had the Holy Stairs (Scala Sancta) transported from Pontius Pilate's Palace in Jerusalem to Rome. For those who are able, you may climb the stairs on your knees, meditating on the Passion of Christ.
- **Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls**, built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. Surrounding the nave are medallions of each pope, from St. Peter to Pope Francis. Independent lunch. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

DAY 6 Friday, August 1: Jubilee for Young People

Breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll participate in the **Jubilee for Young People** (program to be advised). Independent lunch. **Festive Dinner with Bishop Brennan.** Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

DAY 7 Saturday, August 2: Pilgrimage Walk to Vigil Site | Prayer Vigil with Pope Francis

Breakfast at our hotel. Our hotel rooms will be secured for the evening, so pack appropriately for our overnight campout. We will join the multitude of pilgrims on a walking pilgrimage to the vigil site. This evening, the Holy Father will lead us in Adoration, Prayer and Benediction. Overnight at Vigil Site. (B,D)

DAY 8 Sunday, August 3: Closing Papal Mass

Breakfast at our hotel. **Mass with the Holy Father.** Independent lunch. **Reception and farewell dinner on the Terrace of Hotel Kolbe.** Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

DAY 9 Monday, August 4: Return from Rome

After breakfast, we will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for our return flight home. (B)

Two-Day Optional Extension to Turin

DAY 9 Monday, August 4: Continue to Turin | Colle Don Bosco

After breakfast, we will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for our flight to Turin. Collect our luggage then board our private touring bus and we'll be on our way to Colle Don Bosco (i Becchi). Independent lunch. After lunch we'll visit the house where Don Bosco was born and lived until he was 16. We will be greeted by a Salesian Priest (to be confirmed) who will introduce the group to the house where St. John Bosco was born, the house of his brother Giuseppe, the little chapel of Our Lady of the Rosary, the monument representing Mamma Margherita (Don Bosco's mother), and Giovannino acting as a juggler, and the field of Don Bosco's dream. Visit the little Shrine of Mary Help of Christians. The construction started in 1915, on the first centenary of Don Bosco's birth, the year when the liturgical Feast of Mary Help of Christians was instituted. This Shrine Chapel is a place of Eucharistic Adoration for the Salesian Family. This will be a wonderful opportunity to learn about the history of Don Bosco and his spirituality. Return to Turin to check-in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Turin. (B,D)

DAY 10 Tuesday, August 5: Turin

After breakfast, begin our morning tour at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist (*Duomo*) to see the replica of the Shroud of Turin. According to tradition, the 14-foot by 4-foot linen cloth is the burial shroud of Jesus. **Celebrate Mass at the cathedral.** We will also pray at the Shrine of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925), called the "saint for youth of the Third Millennium." After he was beatified in 1990, his body was moved to the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Turin, where it remains today. After lunch, visit the Basilica of Our Lady Help of Christians, a Pontifical church and Marian Shrine. The basilica holds the tombs of saints Don Bosco, Maria Domenica Mazzarello, and Dominic Savio. The building was originally part of the safehouse for poor boys cared for by Don Bosco. We will also visit Casa Don Bosco Museum to experience first-hand the religious and educational sensitivities that shaped the Salesian Family and still flow from it today. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Turin. (B,D)

DAY 11 Wednesday, August 6: Return from Milan

After an early breakfast, transfer to Milan Airport for our return flight home. (B)

Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: All tour deposits are non-refundable upon receipt. If you cancel from 99 days prior to departure up to the day of departure, all payments are non-refundable, including departure taxes & fuel surcharges, single supplement, deviation fees, travel insurance payments, or other costs. Travel insurance is recommended as protection for cancellations due to medical reasons (illness or injury). Travel insurance payments are non-refundable. Tour participation is non-transferable. Names cannot be changed on roster or airline tickets. All refund requests are subject to cancellation terms set forth above. Costs for tour services that are not utilized are non-refundable. We strongly recommend purchasing travel insurance in order to protect your tour package investment. Please read all details very carefully under TRAVEL INSURANCE.

LATE RESERVATIONS: Enrollments received after the deposit deadline are subject to confirmation. Late fees and a possible increase in airfare may apply.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Each traveler is solely responsible for carrying a valid passport and ascertaining knowledge of current entry/exit requirements. **U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date.** Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in 2025, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (ie., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: This travel package includes round-trip estimated economy class airfare from New York. Rates will be confirmed 11 months prior to departure. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Estimated departure taxes & fuel surcharges are subject to increase prior to ticketing. All flights are booked under one itinerary. If a traveler does not travel on any one of the flights in the proper sequence, the rest of the reservation will be automatically canceled by the airline. Rebooking the canceled flight would be subject to a change fee and possible fare difference. If you purchase independent flights, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost(s) if you cancel participation for any reason. **It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT.**

AIRLINE SEATING: A group booking will be confirmed 11 months prior to departure. Under group contracts, seat selection is not permitted. Requests for seat preferences (window or aisle) may be made when you check in for the flight. There is no guarantee that requests will be honored. PWT cannot submit special seat requests on behalf of any passenger. Group reservations may not be accessed online for advance check-in/boarding passes/seat assignments. If seat selection is a condition that affects your decision to travel, it is suggested that you purchase the land only package in order to book your airline arrangements according to your specific needs.

LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: The estimated Land Only package price is \$3,300.00 per person sharing a twin room (\$100 cash discount will be applied if all payments are made by check). The Land Only package does not include group airfare. It is the traveler's responsibility to book airline tickets independently. Any tour participant may change their status to "Land Only" by notifying PWT in writing, up to 100 days prior to departure. Passenger(s) opting for the Land Only package, or deviating from the group itinerary, are responsible for their own transfers to/from the hotel/airport. However, if your flights coordinate with the groups' arrangements, you are welcome to utilize the group transfer(s). **If you purchase your own airline transportation and the group does not materialize or you cancel for any reason, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost of your airfare.**

DEVIATIONS & ITINERARY CHANGES: PWT is pleased to assist clients with special requests. Deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 100 days prior to departure. A deviation fee of \$150 plus any increase in airfare or additional fees may also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact PWT for more information.

TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Overseas round-trip airport transfers are included for passengers who purchase the full air and land package for the group tour dates. Porterage of one piece of luggage at hotels throughout your tour is included. Peter's Way Tours cannot be held liable for any misplaced or lost luggage. It is the passenger's responsibility to make sure their luggage travels with them the entirety of the trip.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested, with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. **If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$695 will apply.** We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

MEALS: Breakfast daily plus one (1) group lunch and six (6) dinners, including festive dinner with Bishop Brennan and farewell dinner on the Terrace of Hotel Kolbe.

GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES: Gratuities to the tour manager, guides, and driver are included in your tour package. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the package price. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave €1 Euro per person for the wait staff after each meal and €1 Euro per person per day for housekeeping.
