



This Week's Reflection

from the Catholic Teaching Committee

Pope Francis on the Gospel of Joy and Parish Community

The US Bishops recommend Pope Francis's Apostolic Exhortation, "The Joy of the Gospel," as a resource for our reflection during this 2025 Jubilee Year. We continue offering selections from that Exhortation in this and subsequent columns (numbers in parentheses refer to the paragraphs of the exhortation; the full text is available online at Vatican.va).

The word "evangelization" is meant to be understood as a way of living out our ordinary, daily Catholic lives in the light of the Gospel message. In that spirit, Pope Francis writes that "God's word is unpredictable in its power.... The Church has to accept this unruly freedom of the word, which accomplishes what it wills in ways that surpass our understanding and ways of thinking." (22)

The Holy Father goes on to reflect on the nature of the parish community as "the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters ... an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the spiritual life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration." (28)

Faith Working Through Love

Pope Francis writes that "what counts above all else is 'faith working through love' (Galatians 5:6). Works of love directed to one's neighbor are the most perfect external manifestation of the interior grace of the Spirit." The Holy Father then quotes St. Thomas Aquinas who writes: 'In itself mercy is the greatest of all virtues, since all the others revolve around it and, more than this, it makes up for their deficiencies. This is particular to the superior virtue, and as such it is proper to God to have mercy, through which his omnipotence is manifested to the greatest degree." (37)

God's Saving Love

PILGRIMS

In Pope Francis's continued reflection on the mission that God has entrusted to each one of us, he writes poignantly that "everyone needs to be touched by the comfort and attraction of God's saving love, which is mysteriously at work in each person, above and beyond their faults and failings." He goes on to say that our task of evangelization never closes itself off, never retreats into its own security, never opts for rigidity and defensiveness. It realizes that it has to grow in

its own understanding of the Gospel and in discerning the paths of the Spirit, and it always does what good it can, even if in the process, its shoes get soiled by the mud of the street." (44-45)
