

This Week's Reflection Pope Benedict XVI on Charity in Truth

Truth needs to be sought, found and expressed within the "economy" of charity, but charity in its turn needs to be understood, confirmed and practiced in the light of truth... Only in truth does charity shine forth, only in truth can charity be authentically lived. Truth is the light that gives meaning and value to charity... Without truth, charity degenerates into sentimentality... Truth frees charity from the constraints of an emotionalism that deprives it of relational and social content, and of a fideism that deprives it of human and universal breathing-space. In the truth, charity reflects the personal yet public dimension of faith in the God of the Bible, who is both Agápe and Lógos: Charity and Truth, Love and Word. (Caritas in Veritate)

Good Friday Stations of the Cross

"At the Cross Her Station Keeping" STABAT MATER DOLOROSA

- **I.** At the cross her station keeping, Stood the mournful mother weeping, Close to Jesus to the last.
- II. Through her heart, His sorrow sharing, All His bitter anguish bearing, Now at length the sword has passed.
- III. Oh, how sad and sore distressed, Was that Mother, highly blest, Of the sole begotten One!
- **IV.** Christ above in torment hangs; She beneath beholds the pangs Of her dying, glorious Son.
- **V.** Is there one who would not weep, 'Whelmed in miseries so deep Christ's dear Mother to behold?
- **VI**. Can the human heart refrain From partaking in her pain, In that Mother's pain untold?
- **VII.** Bruised, derided, cursed, defiled, She beheld her tender Child, All with bloody scourges rent.



Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

- VIII. For the sins of His own nation, Saw Him hang in desolation Till His spirit forth He sent.
 - **IX.** O thou Mother! Fount of love, Touch my spirit from above, Make my heart with yours accord.
 - X. Make me feel as you have felt; Make my soul to glow and melt With the love of Christ, my Lord.
- **XI.** Holy Mother, pierce me through, In my heart each wound renew Of my Savior crucified.
- XII. Let me share with you His pain, Who for all our sins was slain, Who for me in torments died.
- **XIII.** Let me mingle tears with thee, Mourning Him who mourned for me All the days that I may live.
 - **XIV.** By the cross with you to stay, There with you to weep and pray, This I ask of you to give.

The Easter Triduum Services

Triduum (Latin for "three days") represents the most sacred time in the Church year. It begins on the evening of Holy Thursday and ends on the evening of Easter Sunday, the day of the Lord's Resurrection. To celebrate the Triduum services in union with the Church in the privacy of your home, we invite you to pray with us in either of the following ways:

- (1) Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio will celebrate the Triduum services on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday from St Joseph's Co-Cathedral. Those services will be broadcast on NET TV on Spectrum (Channel 97), Optimum (Channel 30) and FIOS (Channel 48), and online at www.netny.tv.
- (2) The priests of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs Parish will celebrate here those same Triduum services, privately, on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. You will be able to view our parish services on our webpage (<u>ourladyqueenofmartyrs.org</u>) or through Facebook or YouTube and we hope you will feel free to share the videos with others this holy season!

Please pray with us during these Holydays for the safety and well-being of all, for those who are grievously ill, and for all who care for the sick. May the suffering and Risen Christ continue to watch you and your loved ones! Thank you.



A HOLY WEEK REFLECTION

In the spring of 1972, I joined a group of my seminarian classmates from Rome, Italy, to participate in a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. It was a memorable trip led by a renowned American Jesuit who had done extensive research in the land where Jesus lived and died and rose again. One of the memories that I have of that pilgrimage is when the Jesuit led a group of us into the back room of a neighborhood bakery in Jerusalem to point out a section of ancient bricks that he said was part of the original old wall of the ancient city where Jesus walked.

Such archeological tidbits tended to fascinate me as a young man in his mid-twenties and excited in me a love of history and tradition. Today, almost fifty years later, as I prepare to begin with all of you a celebration of the central mystery of our faith in the Crucified and Risen Lord, I recognize that the mystery that we celebrate is not a mere historical memory. Although we will be separated physically this year, you and I are invited to enter into this mystery in a profound spiritual way—seeking to unite ourselves more closely with Christ in the depths of our heart.

This year we will meditate again on the same Scriptural passages and observe the same ritual actions, all with the goal of hearing the voice of Christ within us, as He speaks with us, heart to heart. Ironically, our weeks of preparation for Holy Week have taken on a strange sacrificial dimension, imposed by force of the circumstances of a pandemic. The word "quarantine" seems almost related to the Spanish word for Lent, which is "Cuaresma." Hopefully this time has been fruitful in helping to give us a little more time for prayer and meditation. Hopefully it has strengthened our bonds with all those who suffer and with our loved ones.

As we begin the week that is called "Holy," we pray that the Suffering and Risen Christ will draw us closer to him and deepen the life of the Spirit within us. This year the deacon will sing the Easter Proclamation and we will hear again those comforting words: "O wonder of your humble care for us! O love, O charity beyond all telling."

Perhaps in the midst of social distancing and sheltering in place, we will find it a little more difficult to take those words to heart. But in the midst of deprivation, we still hold up the glory of the Risen One, "the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ . . . who . . . has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen."

May you and your loved ones know the joy of the Risen Christ this year and always!

Parish Giving also has a smartphone app for iOS, which makes it even easier. We use it all the time for when we know we will be traveling (but not anytime soon, sadly). Please remember your parish during these difficult times—even though we cannot attend Mass in person or even visit our beloved church to say a quiet prayer or light a candle. We must help to sustain OLQM so that it too is not a victim of COVID-19.
