This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching



St. Maximilian Kolbe and the Eucharist

"Be a Catholic. When you kneel before an altar do it in a way that others may be able to recognize that you know before whom you kneel." (St. Maximilian Kolbe)

REFLECT: The church celebrates the feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe on August 14. Born in 1894 near Lodz, Poland, Fr. Kolbe was ordained in 1918 and began his Marian apostolate. He was arrested by the Gestapo in 1939 and released a few months later. He was again arrested in 1941 and eventually sent to Auschwitz. There, Fr. Kolbe "offered his life in place of an unknown man sentenced to death, in retaliation for the escape of a prisoner; he was locked up in a bunker to starve to death. [He died] on August 14, 1941, the eve of the Assumption, finished by an injection of poison" (Pope St John Paul II).

While known for his devotion to Blessed Mother, "the Immaculate," this martyr of Auschwitz had a tremendous love for the Eucharist, once praying, "Your Blood flows in my blood; your soul, O God incarnate, penetrates my soul, strengthening and nourishing it." Eucharistic Adoration was a part of his daily life since the seminary. He once said, "Eucharistic Adoration is the greatest power in the universe, capable of transforming us and changing the face of the world."

At Auschwitz, stripped of his clerical garb and subjected to dehumanizing beatings, he was asked why he sacrificed so much without regard to his own person; he simply replied, "I am a Catholic priest." At another time he said, "The concerns of the Sacred Heart of Jesus are my concerns." It was in the starvation bunker, notes Pope St John Paul II, when he "no longer celebrated Holy Mass in the sacramental sense, that he celebrated to the very last, with his life, and with his death, the holy sacrifice. In that way Father Kolbe participated in that great sacrament of our faith which is the Eucharist."

ACT: "Receive Jesus and accept everything from His hands with the same dispositions which the all holy Virgin Mary had at the moment of the Annunciation" (Fr. Kolbe).


