This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Social Teaching

Summer with the Saints: Saint Augustine (Feast Day August 28th)

A Christian is: a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks, and a hand through which Christ helps. (St. Augustine)

REFLECT: "There are many kinds of alms, by giving of which we assist to procure the pardon of our sins.... But none of those is greater than to forgive from the heart a sin that has been committed against us. For it is a comparatively small thing to wish well to, or even to do good to, a man who has done no evil to you. It is a much higher thing, and is the result of the most exalted goodness, to love your enemy, and always to wish well to, and when you have the opportunity, to do good to, the man who wishes you ill, and, when he can, does you harm. This is to obey the command of God: 'Love your enemies, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which persecute you.'

"But seeing that this is a frame of mind only reached by the perfect sons of God, and that though every believer ought to strive after it, and by prayer to God and earnest struggling with himself endeavor to bring his soul up to this standard, yet a degree of goodness so high can hardly belong to so great a multitude as we believe are heard when they use this petition, 'Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;' in view of all this, it cannot be doubted that the implied undertaking is fulfilled if a man, though he has not yet attained to loving his enemy, yet, when asked by one who has sinned against him to forgive him his sin, does forgive him from his heart." (St. Augustine, Enchiridion)

Walking "To Jesus Through Mary"

The Marian symbol newly impressed in the cement on the church plaza is to remind us of our church's dedicated to Mary.

The elements of the engraved design on the pavement capture major Marian themes. First is the Miraculous Medal cross, which represents Christ's sacrifice for our salvation. The bar under the cross that runs through the letter "M" stands for Mary and her presence at the foot of the cross. Above the Miraculous Medal cross is engraved an additional symbol — a crown, which represents Mary's title as Queen of Heaven.

The engraving was originally slated be done in summer 2022, but because the sidewalk on Ascan Avenue needed attention this year, the project was advanced. After the heat tracers for winter were embedded in the cement, a local artist added the engraving. The design was suggested by Father Passenant, but he says this creative project took but a "committee of one—the Holy Spirit—to be acted on and executed." And it has turned out beautifully. Deacon Greg notes that the engraving on the pavement on entry to the church further signifies that Mary shows us the way to Jesus.
