

This Week's Reflection from Catholic Teaching St. Dominic Guzman: Feast Day, August 9th

"The greatest charity is to give people the Word of God." (St. Dominic)

REFLECT: St. Dominic was born in Caleruega, Spain, around 1170. After he was ordained a priest, St, Dominic became aware of two enormous challenges facing the Church of his time: the existence of people who were not yet evangelized and the activity of heretical groups that undermined the faith of the Catholic people. He resolved to address these challenges by founding the Order of Preachers.

In his chronicle of the origin of the order, Blessed Jordan of Saxony wrote that while he "labored to make his own soul pleasing to God, the fire of divine love was daily more and more enkindled in his breast, and he was consumed with an ardent zeal for the salvation of infidels and sinners. To move the divine mercy to regard them with pity, he spent often whole nights in the church at prayer, watering the steps of the altar with abundance of tears, in which he was heard to sigh and groan before the Father of mercy, in the earnestness and deep affliction of his heart; never ceasing to beg with the greatest ardor, the grace to gain some of those unhappy souls to Christ."

"This great Saint," wrote Pope Benedict, "reminds us that in the heart of the Church a missionary fire must always burn. It must be a constant incentive to make the first proclamation of the Gospel and, wherever necessary, a new evangelization. Christ is the most precious good that the men and women of every time and every place have the right to know and love! May the life of St. Dominic de Guzmán spur us all to be fervent in prayer, courageous in living out our faith and deeply in love with Jesus Christ." Let us ask God to always enrich the Church with authentic preachers of the Gospel.



RCIA is becoming OCIA

The mission remains the same, but the name is changing. **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults** is the new name for our program of religious education for adults age 18 or older who are wishing to join the Catholic Church or need to complete their Sacraments. The program guides you through the process of discernment, prayer, and education. For catechumens (unbaptized adults), the formation period is two years. We will have more information coming soon about the curriculum and dates.

Understanding NYS Prop One on the November Ballot

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5, 2024. In November, voters in New York will decide on a statewide ballot proposal called Proposal One (also known as the NY Equal Rights Amendment).

The New York State Catholic Conference opposes Prop One because this vaguely worded amendment to the state constitution could undermine the right to life and infringe on parents' rights.

Prop One would replace existing state protections with new measures that the state's Catholic leaders believe have not been thoroughly discussed. While abortion is already legal in the state, the language of the proposal could be used to make abortion at any stage a state constitutional right and make future challenges difficult. There is also concern that Prop One could potentially lead to state authority over parental rights in making medical decisions for children, particularly related to gender identity.

The NY State Catholic Conference encourages voting NO on Prop One this November.
