A View from the Pew: Peace on Earth

The earth is at the end of another year, as darkness falls. The world remains troubled—haunted by petty problems and wars that keep erupting on the face of the planet. "Tis the season, though, and we seek color and warmth. We light candles and sing songs and hang tinsel and wish each other well. We listen for angels and look for stars. And we wonder if there will ever be peace on earth.

We have been wondering about this for a long time. We pray for it. We hope for it. We wait for it, like children wait for Saint Nicholas. It is hard to wait in a cold and unforgiving time of year. But we do it. We live with it, this season of expectation, this unending upward spiral of hope.

I think, underneath the wrapping paper and ribbon, that this is the true essence of Christmas. It is hope.

It is the unwavering belief that help is coming. It is God's promise kept. It is the sure knowledge that soon the nights will grow shorter, and it will get warmer. It is the steadfast certainty of spring. Somewhere, under the cold earth, seeds are waiting.

This is the reason for the season. It is the assurance that God cares enough about us to become one of us. If He is able to do that, what else might He be capable of? We look to the skies, searching for a star.

We live in troubled times, on a troubled planet. But look up. Fireworks will explode. A ball will drop. Have hope.

Hope may well be a mysterious part of God's imprint upon us—one way in which He has tagged us as His own.

In this season, there may be no sweeter expression of God's continuing work within us than to hope for peace and pray for it.

I think God is hoping with us. And praying with us, too.

Monday Evening Bible Study Wraps Up with Advent Reflections



The "O Antiphons" are brief prayers recited or sung at Mass daily during the Octave before Christmas. On the eighth day, December 24, Christmas Eve, the prayer is part of the Christmas Vigil. Each prayer begins with "O" and expresses an Old Testament hope for the coming of the Messiah. The O Antiphons are the inspiration for the hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

December 17—O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18—O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19—O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20—O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21—O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22—O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23—O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

Take home a copy of the O Antiphons prayers that we have in church and recite the short prayers at home as part of your preparations for Christmas. The prayer sheet, which explains the Latin roots and meaning of each prayer, is also available online at ourladyqueenofmartyrs.org/o-antiphons.
