All is calm The Story of Silent Night

On Christmas Eve of 1818, "Silent Night" was performed for the first time in a small church in Oberndorf near Salzburg, Austria. In the 200 years since, many changes have unfolded in the world, but the global message of peace found in Silent Night persists.

The song is perhaps the most famous Christmas carol worldwide, but the Austrian provinces are most closely associated with the song's history. Father Josef Mohr (1792-18480), an Austrian Catholic priest, wrote the words and Franz Xaver Gruber (1797-1863), an organist, composed the music. Here is their story. cont'p. 5

Silent Night cont'd from p. 3

On December 23, 1818, Father Mohr attended a Christmas play that told of the events in the first chapters of Matthew and Luke. The presentation put him in a meditative mood. Taking a longer way home and stopping on a hill that overlooked his peaceful snow-covered village, he thought about the Christmas play he had just seen and remembered a poem he had written a couple of years before. The poem was about the night when angels announced the birth of the long-awaited Messiah to shepherds on a hillside. Father Mohr decided those word might make a good carol for his congregation on Christmas Eve.

With the church organ broken and only a few hours to work, Gruber managed to compose a soothing lullaby for the newly born baby Jesus. It no longer mattered to Mohr and Gruber that their church organ was inoperable. They now had a Christmas carol that could be sung to the accompaniment of Gruber's guitar. It was sung for the first time at Midnight Mass in 1818 in a simple arrangement for guitar and choir. Within a few years, arrangements of the carol appeared in churches in the Salzburg Archdiocese. Thanks to the Tirolean national singers, the song spread from the Zillertal Valley to the rest of Europe, then to America, and was translated into hundreds of languages for the entire world. Wherever it was sung, it made people immediately sit up and listen.

The composition captures the ineffable mystery of the incarnation and birth of our Lord: The holy infant Jesus, who is Christ the Savior, Son of God, and Love's pure light, was born of Mary and filled the world with the redeeming grace from Heaven. As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, may we truly take to heart the words of "Silent Night" and may its message be carried in our own thoughts, word, and deeds.—*Contributed by Lorraine Garvilla*



Memorable Christmas Concert

Far too many to thank in this space, from our Religious Education student volunteers, parish choir members, guest soloists, hosts, and audience members. We will have more coverage of our December 9th, 2018 Christmas Concert soon.

Parish Planning for the Future

Bishop DiMarzio has authorized our Territorial Vicar, the Very. Rev. Thomas Pettei, and his assistant Ms. Ellen Rhatigan to give presentations on the topic of future planning to parish leaders in each deanery. Father Passenant accompanied a group of our parish leaders to our deanery meeting on Thursday, November 29.

Among the statistics that were distributed at the meeting were the following:

- In 2006, there were 309 priests assigned to active parish ministry.
- In 2017, there were 273 priests assigned to active parish ministry, a 12 percent decrease.
- A large number of priests will retire in the next 5 to 10 years.
- There are currently 17 parishes with two worship sites and 4 parishes with three worship sites.
- There are currently 186 Catholic parishes in Brooklyn and Queens.

Among other items, there are two takeaways from the informational meeting. The first is the call to continue

to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The second is to begin to think about the idea of parish partnerships. Such partnerships would encourage the sharing of ministries, services, and resources between neighboring parishes.

One example of such sharing is seen in the support that our parish gives to the food pantries at Our Lady of Mercy and Our Lady of the Angelus. Instead of duplicating a third food pantry here, we contribute to the two neighboring food pantries that already exist.

Another example of such sharing is through the collaboration of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs and Our Lady of Mercy (OLM) in basketball, swimming, and track, assisted by the Catholic Youth Organization.

A third example of such sharing is seen in the collaboration between OLM and OLQM in the parish youth program. As we move forward, we hope that other ways of collaborating will develop.


