

# This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

The Malice of Sin, Part I

"Sin directs the heart of the wicked man; his eyes are closed to the fear of God. For he lives with the delusion: his guilt will not he known and hated." (Psalm 36: 2-3)

**REFLECT:** Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange warns that "only the saints could tell us all the evil that a deliberate venial sin contains.... The smallest venial sin is a greater evil than all sufferings, all disgraces, all ruins, and all purely physical evils." St. Theresa of Avila echoes this when she writes of the "malice" of intentional sin. "It is as though one were to say: 'Lord, although this displeases Thee, I shall do it. I know that Thou seest it and I know that Thou wouldst not have me do it; but, though I understand this, I would rather follow my own whim and desire than Thy will.' If we commit a sin in this way, however slight, it seems to me that our offence is not small but very, very great."

"To penetrate more fully the seriousness of venial sin," writes Lagrange, "especially if it is deliberate, we must consider its consequences. "In the very instant in which it is committed, venial sin deprives the soul of a precious grace. In that instant, grace was offered us to make progress in perfection, to be charitable, to be fervent.... If we had corresponded, our merit would have increased... we would have contemplated God more intensely, we would have loved Him more. Now this grace has been lost by our [selfishness]....

"Considering that God has deigned with infinite goodness to show us the way that leads to happiness, are we not foolish if we refuse to follow?... Yet, we say, not with words but with deeds: 'Lord, I don't want the sanctity You offer me, I don't want habitual union with Christ. Let me live in mediocrity... it is better for me."

But no, let us pray with St. Theresa, "From any sin, however small, committed with full knowledge, may God deliver us."

**NO FLOWERS DURING LENT:** Please refrain from leaving flowers in the church and on the altars during Lent. Flowers as symbols of joy are not appropriate during this solemn season. The Fourth Sunday of Lent, also called "Laetare Sunday" (Rejoice) is the one day in Lent that flowers will appear on the altar, as we take a moment to look forward, with hope, to Easter.



## LENTEN REGULATIONS

**Abstinence:** The Church asks all Catholics age 14 and older to abstain from meat on **all Fridays** of Lent.

**Fasting:** All Catholics ages 18 to 59 are obligated to fast on **Good Friday** (March 29). Limit yourself to a **single full meal** and two smaller ones during the day, with no food between meals.

Easter Duty: All Catholics who have received their first Holy Eucharist are expected to receive Communion at least once a year, between the **First Sunday of Lent** (February 18) and **Trinity Sunday** (May 26).

**Penance:** All Fridays throughout the year and Lent are penitential days for prayerful remembrance of the Passion of Jesus Christ. While abstinence in a true spirit of penance is commended, individuals may substitute other practices of voluntary self-denial or personal penance, such as acts of temperance, prayer, or charity.


