

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Social Teaching

Pope Benedict on Holiness

"Do not act in compliance with the desires of your former ignorance but, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct." (1 Peter 1: 14-15)

REFLECT: "Holiness, the fullness of Christian life, does not consist in carrying out extraordinary enterprises but in being united with Christ, in living his mysteries, in making our own his example, his thoughts, his behavior. The measure of holiness stems from the stature that Christ achieves in us, in as much as with the power of the Holy Spirit, we model our whole life on his....

"Holiness is nothing other than charity lived to the full.... God has poured out his love in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us; therefore the first and most necessary gift is charity, by which we love God above all things and our neighbor through love of him. But if charity, like a good seed, is to grow and fructify in the soul, each of the faithful must willingly hear the word of God and carry out his will with deeds, with the help of his grace. He must frequently receive the sacraments, chiefly the Eucharist, and take part in the holy liturgy; he must constantly apply himself to prayer, self-denial, active brotherly service and the exercise all the virtues....

"I would like to ask all to open themselves to the action of the Holy Spirit, who transforms our life, to be, we too, as small pieces in the great mosaic of holiness that God continues to create in history, so that the face of Christ may shine out in the fullness of its splendor. Let us not be afraid to aim high, for God's heights; let us not be afraid that God will ask too much of us, but let ourselves be guided by his Word in every daily action, even when we feel poor, inadequate, sinners. It will be he who transforms us in accordance with his love." (General Audience, 4/13/2011)

A Message for Lent and the Eucharistic Revival

It gives me great joy to be able to welcome you during the beginning of this holy season of Lent, which we celebrate year after year in the Universal Church. In addition to being a season in which we grow closer to the Lord through prayer and almsgiving and fasting, it's also a season in which we pray for those who will receive the fullness of the sacraments at the fount of baptism and receive their confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. We pray for our catechumens and our candidates in a special way during this season.

This Lent of 2023 is made special for other reasons, too. The diocese will sponsor a Lenten pilgrimage, inviting people to go from church to church to pray during a year of Eucharistic revival. Our church will be open to receive those pilgrims on Tuesday, March 21st, beginning with the opportunity to go to confession in the morning at 11:30 a.m., to celebrate the Eucharist with us at noon, and then to spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for the rest of the day until 7:30 in the evening. The adoration of the Eucharist is—as one Benedictine friar called it—the Mass held in contemplation.

We invite you to take advantage of this opportunity on Tuesday, March 21st, to contemplate the Eucharist, and on the Thursdays of Lent. We offer this opportunity not only during Lent but on Thursdays throughout the year as well, during our weekly Thursday devotions dedicated to the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The bishops of our country are inviting us to spend this year in a type of Eucharistic revival—that is to say, contemplating the gift of the Eucharist, cherishing the gift of this sacrament, and seeking really to live this sacrament and to take advantage of its grace.

The Eucharistic revival is an invitation, if we have been away from the Mass, to come back to Mass and to share its riches, listen to God's Word, and celebrate with the people of God the great sacrifice and Eucharistic prayer. We encourage you to make this Lenten season special and to make the Eucharist a continued center of your spiritual life.

Join us Sunday after Sunday here at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs; pray with us and deepen your understanding of the presence and the call of Christ in your heart. We pray that you may enjoy a blessed Lenten season. We join with you in prayer, and we rejoice with you in the many gifts that God gives his people. Amen.
