### This Week's Reflection from Catholic Teaching

#### On Care for Our Common Home: Taking Action

To better protect God's creation, consider *lifestyle changes* you can make as an individual or family to reduce your own consumption and *institutional changes* you can support in your community, school, or workspace. Here are some ideas based on those Pope Francis mentions in *Laudato Si*' (no. 211):

#### AT HOME

1. Use fewer paper and plastic products (e.g., choose a reusable water bottle).

2. Reduce your water consumption (e.g., take shorter showers, wash dishes by hand).

3. Don't cook more than you will consume.

4. Compost (instead of disposing) food waste.

5. Recycle and reuse items (instead of disposing).

7. Use public transportation, carpool, walk, or ride a bike.

8. Conserve electricity (e.g., turn off lights, buy energy-efficient appliances).

9. Plant trees.

#### IN MY PARISH, AT SCHOOL, AT WORK

1. Ensure that learning about care for God's creation is part of Catholic faith formation for adults and youth (resources are freely available at www.usccb.org/environment).

2. During Laudato Si' week (May 24-31, 2025), engage in daily activities of prayer, learning, and action to do less harm to the environment.

3. Do an energy audit to improve energy efficiency and costs (benefiting both the earth and your institution's budget!).

4. Explore any solar cooperatives in your local community.

5. Implement recycling and composting.

6. In cafeterias and other dining areas, replace disposable cups, plates, and silverware with washable or compostable items.

7. Donate leftover food to local soup kitchens.

8. Offer employees benefits for using public transportation or carpooling.

9. Conserve electricity (e.g., turn off air conditioning during nonbusiness hours) and buy energy-efficient appliances.

10. Plant trees on your institution's property.

11. Consider what other parishes are doing to care for God's creation. For inspiration, read about one Illinois parish's green team at https://tinyurl.com/ysz2byc5.


