

Vatican II on the Dignity of Human Life

From the OLOM Social Action Committee

Women and men are not mistaken when they regard themselves as superior to merely bodily creatures and as more than mere particles of nature or nameless units in human society. For by their power to know themselves in the depths of their being they rise above the entire universe of mere objects. When they are drawn to think about their real selves they turn to those deep recesses of their being where God who probes the heart awaits them, and where they themselves decide their own destiny in the sight of God. So when they recognize in themselves a spiritual and immortal soul, this is not an illusion, a product of their imagination, to be explained solely in terms of physical or social causes. On the contrary, they have grasped the profound truth of the matter. (Gaudium et Spes, 1965, #14)



Feast of St. Blaise and Blessing of Throats Monday, February 3 at the Daily Masses

He was believed to be a physician before being consecrated a bishop, and he was known as a healer who once saved the life of a boy who was choking on a fish bone. Since then, he has been revered as the patron of those who suffer from ailments of the throat.



Annual Anointing of the Sick Mass Tuesday, February 11 at 12:05 p.m.

Once a year, our parish offers an opportunity for the reception of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Through anointing, the grace of the Holy Spirit comforts and strengthens the soul of the sick person. The anointing with oil of the sick is available for those who wish to receive it.

This Mass in particular is intended for those who have illness, are anticipating surgery, the frail and elderly, and anyone in need of healing of body, mind, or spirit. Please join us to be anointed or simply to pray for the healing of those who are there to be anointed, and their caregivers.

This Mass is also being held in observance of the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and World Day of the Sick.

Every 10 years, the U.S. government counts every person living in the United States regardless of their immigration status. Correct census results allow our communities to receive funding that shapes our local healthcare, housing, education, transportation, employment and public policy.

Check your mail between March 12 and March 20 for an invitation to respond online to the 2020 Census; some households will also receive paper questionnaires. The questions pertain to household size, familial relationship of household members, whether you rent or own your home, and demographics (e.g., sex, age, race, ethnicity). The Census will NOT ask about social security numbers, politics, bank/credit card information, or will NOT ask for money.
