This Week's Reflection from the Catholic Teaching Committee What Is a Plenary Indulgence?

In last week's column, we discussed indulgences. The New York State Catholic Conference provides us with another reflection on a plenary indulgence, stating:

"A plenary indulgence is a Catholic grant that removes all temporal punishment for sin, provided the person meets certain conditions, like confession, Eucharist, and prayer for the Pope's intentions. It is typically granted for specific acts of devotion, such as during a Jubilee year, and differs from absolution, which forgives sin itself. The Vatican decree [outlined] the different ways Catholics may obtain the Plenary Indulgence during the 2025 Jubilee Year:

1. Pilgrimage to any sacred Jubilee site [our church has been designated a sacred Jubilee site by Bishop Brennan—a shrine church—for the Jubilee of Hope 2025]



- 2. Pious visits to sacred places
- 3. Works of mercy and penance"

The Archdiocese of Boston reminds use that "a pious visit to a Jubilee site, cathedral, co-cathedral, or basilica must include engagement in Eucharistic adoration for a suitable time, the recitation of an Our Father and a profession of faith, and the invocation of Mary's intercession. Or, if unable to travel for serious reasons (cloistered, infirm, or imprisoned), one must piously unite oneself to those who make pious visits and pilgrimages, recite an Our Father, make a profession of faith, [recite] other prayers related to the Jubilee, and offer up their sufferings and hardships."






On the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, we will bid farewell to this sacred word for the duration of Lent.
