# Happy Anniversary, Father Passenant!




To start, the day he was ordained, February 24, 1979, was extra special because, coincidentally, it was his parents' wedding anniversary!


#### **Pre-OLQM Years**

A Brooklyn native, Fr. Passenant served during his first 12 years as a priest at Holy Family, Canarsie; St. Mary Star of the Sea, Far Rockaway; Blessed Sacrament, Cypress Hills; St. Patrick's, Bay Ridge; St. Benedict Joseph Labre, Richmond Hill; and St. Brendan, Midwood. Then an accidental—or providential—encounter with a Sister of Mercy, who asked him to celebrate Mass at a prison, turned into a nearly 13-year assignment (1991–2003) as a chaplain for the New York City Department of Corrections (NYCDOC).

This experience helped shape him as a portrayer of the sometimes funny, often poignant aspects of human nature. During this period he saw firsthand how "hope is a very powerful gift and faith is a powerful strength," he says.

Fr. Passenant was part of the chaplaincy response after the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, bringing the Mass and the sacraments and spiritual counsel to those deployed to ground zero.





#### Nearly 15 Years at OLQM

Fr. Passenant came to OLQM as an associate pastor under Msgr. Joseph Funaro. His first Sunday assignment was the 5 p.m. Mass on July 3, 2004. In 2009, he celebrated his 30th anniversary as a priest with us. In June 2013, he was named parish administrator by Bishop Paul R. Sanchez.

Last month Bishop DiMarzio named him regional

dean for Queens North Deanery #6, which includes nine parishes in our area. These are additional responsibilities while he continues in the pivotal role as administrator at our parish.

Flashback to 2004: Fr. Passenant expressed his belief in all the untapped talent sitting in the pews of this church. Over these past 15 years he has tapped people's goodwill and helped to grow our ministries of lectoring, ushering, singing in the choir, and altar serving. He has inspired many of the youth and parents in our parish.

Continued blessings for Fr. Passenant! We look forward to his next milestone and half-century celebration.

#### Faith and Action

Bishop DiMarzio offered these thoughts for our reflection at the recent Cathedral Club dinner on February 7, 2019. (The link to his full talk is posted on our website.)

"The malicious Reproductive Health Act recently signed into law does nothing to protect the lives and health of women in our state ... it is an extremist, pro-abortion piece of legislation.... It is infanticide."

He goes on to say that the ultimate penalty for a politician is to vote that politician out of office. By saying this, he reminds us that we need to be registered voters who participate in the electoral process. He also reminds us that only five legislators from Brooklyn and Queens voted "no" on the Reproductive Health Care Act: Senator Joseph Addabbo, Senator Simcha Felder, Assemblyman Nicole Malliotakis, Assemblyman Simcha Eichenstein, and Assemblyman William Colton. Two elected officials here in this area of Queens voted in favor of this "malicious" act: Senator Toby Stavisky and Assemblyman Andrew Hevesi.

The Bishop further states that "years ago, the politics of abortion were defined by the Clintonian 'safe, legal, and rare,' but now we are at a point where the Democratic establishment of New York State promotes abortion."

Let us pray for wisdom for our elected leaders and, as the Bishop says, "support candidates for political office that reflect good moral values."—*Bishop Sanchez* 

#### A Word from Bishop Sanchez

As you will read in this week's *Tablet*, the Diocese of Brooklyn has published on its website a list of clergy who have been credibly accused of sexual abuse of a minor. Following is a shortened version of a statement the Diocese has released:

The majority of these priests who are credibly accused are already deceased. Those who are living have either been laicized or permanently removed from active ministry. The Church recognizes the pain that has been caused to those who are victims of child abuse, as well as to their families. The victims have been offered the opportunity for counseling as well as financial reparation through the special Compensation program (IRCP)....

Since 2002 and the "Charter for Protection of Children and Young People," the Church has taken many steps to prevent such abuse from happening.... Every member of the clergy, every lay employee and volunteer who has contact with children is required to undergo a background check (which is now reviewed quarterly) as well as participate in a training program on abuse prevention. We also publicize the independent reporting line to facilitate filing reports of abuse within our Diocese, which immediately are communicated to civil authorities. That number is: 888-634-4499

We ask God to watch over us, and to give us the fortitude to face the painful truth of abuse, as we move forward to healing and reconciliation.
