This Week's Reflection from Catholic Teaching

The Malice of Sin, Part 2

"But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us." (Romans 5: 8)

REFLECT: In our last reflection we considered the seriousness and foolishness of deliberate venial sin. Today, we consider the sinner's perverse willfulness. From the beginning, writes Pope St. John Paul II, "sin has appeared as an act of the will of the creature-man contrary to the will of God; indeed, sin has appeared in opposition to the truth.... Man has followed the 'father of lies,' setting himself up in opposition to the Father of life and the Spirit of truth" (Dominum et Vivificantem).

Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange describes this as a "profound evil of the will. Indeed, however great his blindness may be, the conscience of the sinner is aware that the [sinful] act he is about to accomplish is contrary to the law of God, to his own interest, to that which is better and nobler in himself, to right reason, and to charity." What's more, writes Lagrange, sin is not only a profound evil of the intelligence and will, "but considered in relation to God it is also the blackest ingratitude." After all, God has given us everything, including his Son. "What we have said should be sufficient to make us hate [sin], make us understand how much God himself detests it, and how much His infinitely delicate love is wounded by it."

Yet each Lent, John Paul writes, "God himself invites us to undertake a journey of penance and inner purification in order to renew our faith. He calls us ceaselessly to himself, and whenever we experience the defeat inflicted by sin he shows us the way back to his house, where we find again that unique loving care which he has lavished on us in Christ. Thus, gratitude fills our hearts because of the experience of love which the Father shows us" (Pope St. John Paul II, October 15, 1998).

ACT: Consider regular confession.

Declutter with a Lenten Purpose


Next Sunday Only March 3rd from 9 a.m. to noon St. Vincent de Paul Clothing Donation Truck


