





# St. "Padre Pio" Novena

January 11–19

Recited at the 12:05 p.m. Masses (Mon-Sat) and after 11:15 a.m. Masses on Sundays

St. Pio of Pietrelcina, known as "Padre Pio," had the stigmata and is regarded as a miracle worker. Although his feast day is September 23, he is sometimes referred to as the unofficial patron saint of the January blues and stress relief, owing to his famous words, "Pray, hope, and don't worry. Worry is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer."

We encourage you to take a copy of the novena prayer sheet (available in the church) and ask for his intercession. Each novena prayer ends with a variation of the prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which Padre Pio recited daily as his go-to prayer for all those who asked for his intercession.

#### Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

O my Jesus, you have said: "Truly I say to you, ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and it will be opened to you." Behold I knock, I seek and ask for the grace of ... (state your intention).

Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory Be to the Father.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you. Amen.

## Take Home a Christmas Poinsettia

The poinsettias from our beautiful Christmas altar display are ready for new homes! If you'd like to give one of these plants a second life, you can take one home with you after Mass **today**.

To care for the plant at home—Keep it in a comfortable spot with temperatures between 55°F and 71°F, away from drafts and heat sources. Place it in bright, indirect light and water only when the soil is dry. By late winter, when the color petals fade and fall off, you can prune and fertilize the plant. Through summer, with proper watering and light, new green shoots should start to grow, and you can repot the plant if needed. In fall, give your poinsettia 12 hours of darkness daily to encourage blooming. By November, it should develop color. With some TLC, your poinsettia can bloom again and brighten your home for next Christmas!
