

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

Promoting Ethical Consumption to Combat Slavery

"Purchasing is always a moral—and not simply economic—act. Hence the consumer has a specific social responsibility." (Pope Benedict XVI)

REFLECT: According to Global Estimates of Modern Slavery, 28 million people (including 3.3 million children) were in forced labor in 2021. This slave trade is so embedded in our supply chains that it is near impossible to avoid consuming goods or services free from the taint of human trafficking and modern slavery. We are all involved, but we can reduce our "slavery footprint." This reflection has guidelines and select references to get you started.

First, learn how modern slavery operates in the supply chain, what countries and companies are involved, and what products are involved. Learn how slavery is likely to present where you live and work. Consider downloading the Labor Department's free app, Sweat & Toil (see resources below).

Second, take the survey at slaveryfootprint.org to determine how many slaves work for you, then commit to being an ethical consumer. Third, actually *be an ethical consumer*. Fourth, where possible, buy slave-free products; use slave-free services; buy survivor-made goods. Fifth, support organizations working to end modern slavery. Buy from merchants committed to ethical trade using transparent, slave-free supply chains.

Sixth, determine what you truly need versus what you want. It is heartbreaking to have to buy a necessity that supports slavery because no other option is available. It is immoral to buy a slavery-supporting nonessential. Seventh, consider living a simpler, holier life; read Fr. Dubay's book on embracing a life of Gospel poverty.
