

This Week's Reflection from the Catholic Teaching Committee The Blessings of Age: Part 2

We have been reflecting on the 1999 document, "A Pastoral Message on Growing Older within the Faith Community," from the United States Bishops on the connection between aging and wisdom. We offer some excerpts and reflections from that document here.



Growing in Wisdom

"Growing in holiness means dealing with life's inevitable losses. More positively, growth in holiness leads to wisdom. Although many cultures revere older people for their wisdom, wisdom does not come automatically with age. The experiences of a lifetime have sown the seeds, but they must be cultivated by prayer and reflection on those experiences in light of the Gospel. With God's grace, as one matures, one arrives at wisdom: the realization that we come from God and are going to God. Or as St. Augustine said, 'Our hearts were made for you, O Lord, and they are restless until they rest in you.'

"The wise person is always growing, always learning. The wise person is always connecting the past with the future. Elders share their stories, and in doing so, pass on what they have learned to future generations, through both words and example. Their wisdom does not die with them but guides and enriches generations to come.

The Call to Community

"People become holy within a community. For most people, including older persons, the primary community is the family. "You rejoice in additions to your family circle—daughters-inlaw and sons-in-law, grandchildren, great-nieces, and nephews. You pass on your family's cultural heritage through stories, celebrations, and rituals. You worry about a child's divorce or a grandchild's exposure to drugs and violence. Some of you find yourselves in unexpected situations, such as caring for older family members or, at the other end of the spectrum, for grandchildren. In the midst of change, you are often a point of stability, a steadfast example of faith deepened by the joys and heartaches of family life. For many, these are profound experiences of God's love and care.

"Some of you experience the special joys of grandparenting.



Freed from the responsibilities of dayto-day parenting, you give young family members the gift of unhurried time and attention. With the experience of years, you can continue to encourage children to develop new skills or talents and to make important life decisions." Order of Mass Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Church Bell Tower: Major Repair Project

This week's cover photo shows our church bell tower rising above the summer treetops. It is a familiar and meaningful part of our church grounds and a symbol of our church's enduring presence in the community.

The tower is now in need of major repair. In the upper section of the bell tower, water infiltration during rain is saturating the masonry and concrete slabs, causing spalling bricks and falling concrete. The visible white residue on the bricks is further evidence of freeze-thaw damage, as water soaks through the masonry, freezes, and leaches out minerals—primarily calcium. Addressing this water damage inside the structure is now a priority.

Father Passenant met with the parish trustees as well as the finance and stewardship committees to discuss a fundraising program to cover the costs of this major repair project. The preliminary estimate is higher than anticipated. In the meantime, to show everyone the extent of the damage, we have posted a short video on the parish website in the News section (ourladyqueenofmartyrs.org/category/parish-and-diocesan-news/).


