

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

Responding to the Universal Call to Holiness: Part 1

"We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." (John 6: 69)

REFLECT: How should we understand the quality of our response when confronted with God's call to holiness? As the Catholic philosopher Dietrich Von Hildebrand shows, we should come to this encounter with fundamental moral attitudes of reverence, gratitude, and humility. This unfolds in three ways; the first two we cover in this week's reflection.

First, in encountering the tremendous mystery of God, we are called to worship. Recall how when faced with the miraculous gift of a newborn daughter or the majesty of the African night sky, both Dorothy Day and St. Bakhita felt the obligation to worship. For St. Bakhita, it was the desire to "pay him homage." For Dorothy Day, she experienced the "need to worship, to adore." Both would say, as so many have before them, that they had experienced something mysterious and noble and of utmost importance, and they had experienced a Person. We aren't moved to worship a thing or a place, no matter how grand, but only a person.

Our fundamental moral attitudes of reverence, gratitude, and humility flow from this encounter with a personal God and the realization both of our status as creatures and of having received everything we have from God.

This recognition of our status as creatures, our smallness, constitutes the second phase. Even if we were free of sin, we would still be left with the fact of our littleness in the face of the almighty and our complete dependence upon Him for our very existence. But notice the order. What comes first is the recognition of God's glory, which draws us to intimate worship. As Hildebrand states, "Humility calls upon us to allow our hearts to be wounded by the glory of God, to fall on our knees in loving adoration, and to deliver ourselves over to God entirely."


