

## This Week's Reflection from the Catholic Teaching Committee Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati

As part of the year-long celebration of the Jubilee, multiple groups have been invited to make a pilgrimage to Rome to meet with Pope Leo XIV and receive the pilgrimage indulgences. They include youth groups, ecclesial movements, associations and new communities, sports



groups, government representatives, seminarians, bishops, and priests. The days from July 28 through August 3 are dedicated to young adults and young people.

On Sunday, September 7, Pope Leo XIV will canonize Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis, both fitting patrons for youth. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops describe Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as "a global patron and companion for young adults, athletes and ordinary people."

#### Man of the Beatitudes

As the Bishops note: "Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925) was an Italian young person who was affectionately called the 'Man of the Beatitudes' by Saint John Paul II for his exemplary work of bringing comfort and happiness to those who were poor, suffering, meek, hungry, thirsty, and in need of mercy, and who was himself clean of heart, a peacemaker, and persecuted for the sake of the Gospel (cf. Mt 5:3-10). He died at the young adult age of 24 while in charitable service to the people who were sick and dying in his community."

#### Service to the Marginalized

"Pier Giorgio was engaged in the life of the Church through regular worship and adoration, service to the poor and marginalized, advocacy for social justice for the disenfranchised and for religious liberty, regular participation in student and sports activities, devotion to his family, and joyful companionship with his friends and fellow Catholics in his community. He saw many parallels between Catholic life and his favorite pastime sport, mountain-climbing. He would regularly organize trips into the mountains with his close friends with occasions for prayer, liturgies, and conversations about faith on the way up to or down from the summit.... The Catholic Church holds up Pier Giorgio Frassati as an excellent role model for young people and young adults, athletes, and ordinary people for their own journey through life. Just like Frassati, we are continually called to set out on a voyage in our everyday lives to go 'to the heights' to encounter Christ in all things, and in a particular way, through



the community of the Church, those who are poor and marginalized, and the Eucharist."

## Brooklyn Pilgrimage Heads to Rome on Sept. 1 for Historic Canonizations

The Diocese of Brooklyn and Queens invites the faithful on an eight-day Jubilee pilgrimage to Rome and Vatican City from September 1–8 to witness the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. Led by Msgr. Thomas Machalski, pastor of Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Bayside-home to a first-class relic of Blessed Carlo-this spiritually rich journey includes a general audience with Pope Leo XIV, Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter, and the Canonization Mass at St. Peter's Square. Pilgrims will also explore sacred sites across Rome, Vatican City, and optionally Assisi; deluxe accommodations, guided tours, and daily breakfasts included. Cost: starts at \$2,600 (land only, double occupancy, paid by check), with addons like the Assisi day trip for \$150. 
