

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

The Universal Call to Prayer

"When they heard the sound of the LORD God walking about in the garden at the breezy time of the day, the man and his wife hid themselves from the LORD God." (Genesis 3: 8)

REFLECT: The catechism states that "God tirelessly calls each person to that mysterious encounter known as prayer. In prayer, the faithful God's initiative of love always comes first" (2567). In prayer, we experience God's thirst for us. As the catechism states, "Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for him" (2560). The universal call to holiness, then, finds its source in the thirst God has for us.

When we ignore this call, something extraordinary occurs; we hear "God's sorrowful call to his children, pleading, 'where are you? What is this that you have done" (2568). The catechism is, of course, referring to Genesis 3. We know the story. After Adam and Eve sin, God looks for them in the garden, and realizing that they are hiding from him, he cries out to them. But why is God sorrowful?

In an earlier reflection, we discussed God's holiness in the radically intense intimacy he has with us. So here in the garden, he discovers that the very couple he loves, with an infinite love, are hiding from him. As he seeks to approach, they distance themselves.

It is from this deep sorrow that God does something unthinkable. This is beautifully stated in the first paragraph of the catechism: "He calls together all men scattered and divided by sin." Notice the language. It is the language of a shepherd calling his sheep, of a mother calling her children.

God sends his son as redeemer and savior. God takes the amazing initiative of not just creating things; he himself comes among us. Radical transcendence becomes radical imminence. Through his son, God invites us to become holy through the Holy Spirit. We cover our response in our next reflections.
