

This Week's Reflection

USCCB on Religious Minorities in China

From the OLQM Social Action Committee—Over seven weeks in June and July, our reflections focus on Religious Freedom and Religious Persecution, in solidarity with Religious Freedom Week.



Pray for the freedom of the Church in China, and that the rights of all religious minorities would be respected.

REFLECT: Under the Chinese Communist Party, Chinese citizens have limited religious freedom. Since 2013, religious persecution has intensified under a campaign for the “sinicization” of religion—an effort to have religions conform to government-sanctioned interpretations of Chinese culture. Muslims have suffered grievous human rights abuses. Since 2017, 800,000 to possibly 2 million ethnic Uighur, Kazakh, Kyrgyz, and Hui Muslims have been arbitrarily detained in mass internment camps. Other religions are impacted by the government’s sinicization campaign, including the estimated 12 million Catholics in China. While the Vatican has reached a provisional agreement with China on the issue of episcopal appointments, reports of persecution by the Chinese government persist as underground churches are closed and priests detained, crosses destroyed, bibles confiscated, and children younger than age 18 are forbidden from attending Mass and receiving religious instruction. Ultimately time will tell if the faithful will be allowed to practice their religion independent of state control.

ACT: Solidarity with people of faith in other countries begins with learning about their struggles. Stay informed by signing up for the USCCB’s religious liberty newsletter, First Freedom News.

Major Church Repair 2020 Parishioner Report #3

The Fourth of July is upon us and we have begun Masses again with congregations, though limited in numbers. Because of the holiday and the early deadline for this bulletin edition, this article was prepared as we are setting up the Daily Mass space in the Convent Chapel and the Sunday Mass space in McLaughlin Hall as we continue with the church renovation project.

As I am writing to you, we have just completed the first week of work. The picture on the front cover shows the pews moved toward the sanctuary area to clear the floor for restoration. The first phase of the restoration began with the application of paint remover and stripper to return the church floor under the pews to its original color and the slate stone in the aisles to their unique shade and patina. As you read this, a portion of this work should have been completed.

The lighting enhancement project was “roughed in” before the floor work began. The electrician was able to install ten (of twelve) new eight-foot track lights across each upper set of windows in the main body (the nave) of the church. The lighting in each of the bays of the side aisles will receive an additional set of four recessed lights.

Our Father's Day was spent with the lighting technician determining the placement of the recessed lighting in each of the bays of the side aisles. During this time-consuming process, various scenarios were suggested using laser guides to measure. The placement of the recessed lighting was determined after much deliberation and the necessity for the technician to go up and down using the “High-Low” (pictured). It's interesting to note that the builders of this church in 1938, who did not have the precision of today's laser technology, were only off by one-eighth to one-quarter of an inch. Amazing!



The exterior power-washing project has moved to the front of the church on Ascan Avenue. The Queens Blvd. portion of the building, from the Bell Tower toward Ascan Avenue including the Baptistry, has been completed. The granite and limestone surfaces cleaned of 80 years of pollution exposed the beauty of the original granite and limestone. When you read this article, the front face of the Church should be completed, with work continuing on the other heavily soiled areas. MORE NEXT WEEK.

The Return of Public Mass

Dear Parishioners,

Our long wait is over. We returned to **Daily Mass** at 8 a.m. and 12:05 p.m. last Monday, June 29th. We are gathering for Daily Mass in the Convent Chapel (use ramp entrance near the Mary statue) for the time being.

For **Weekend Masses** we will keep the regular Sunday schedule—Saturday evening 5 p.m., Sunday: 9 a.m., 11:15 a.m., and 1 p.m.—but since the church building is undergoing major repairs (*see story on facing page*), we are gathering in the school building auditorium. We can accommodate **150 participants for each Mass in McLaughlin Hall**. Please note that McLaughlin Hall is not air-conditioned but fans will be placed around the hall.

The parish clergy and the other staff members are looking forward to seeing our parish family gathering together again. We really missed you. However, if you do not feel well or **have any of the symptoms affiliated with Covid-19, please stay home**. The Mass dispensation is still in effect.

For everyone's safety it will be necessary to follow the procedures outlined here. **There can be no exceptions; we must continue to protect everyone**. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) norms are expected, as are masks, social distancing, individual hand sanitizing, and gloves, etc.

All must have a face mask and wear it! **NO MASK NO ENTRY**. All must adhere to the "Planned Pattern" for entering McLaughlin Hall, Communion distribution, and exiting. Please cooperate as there can be no exceptions.

(1) Congregants planning to attend Mass **must line up at the McLaughlin Hall door in the schoolyard closest to the church 20 minutes before the start** of the service, maintaining social distancing. The first 125 attendees will fill the seats in the hall. There is space for 25 additional standees. Everyone is expected to sit where assigned. We need everyone's cooperation.

(2) All attending must enter through the designated door of the hall. **Everyone entering the worship space must be ushered to a seat**. Ushers will seat attendees according to a configuration set up in the worship space ahead of time.

(3) Because there are stairs to reach the worship space, we ask that those in wheelchairs and with canes go to the convent using the ramp.

The services planned are not extended; there will be limited singing and short homilies.

(4) Communion distribution will be "in the hand" ONLY, ushered by staff members keeping the CDC six-foot social distancing guideline. **Please wait to be ushered from your row**.

(5) After the Final Blessing, the standees will leave first, followed by those seated. **All must exit the worship space being escorted out by staff** (no staying after Mass). Rest rooms will not be available as per CDC guidelines.

We are confident that everyone will patiently cooperate with these directives, which in charity are for everyone's safety. These are small inconveniences to be able again to attend Mass and receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

We ask God through the intercession of Our Lady as the Queen of Martyrs to guide us in these endeavors.

**2020–2021 School Year
Religious Education Registration**

Registration is open and online only at our parish website at ourladyqueenofmartyrs.org/re. Children’s religious education at OLQM is for students grades 1 through 8 and high school students up to age 16. Each family is asked to complete the online registration form.

For parents enrolling their children, fees are \$130 for one child, \$180 for two children, \$200 for three children. For students receiving First Communion, there is an additional fee of \$50 for sacramental preparation; for students receiving Confirmation the additional fee is \$90.

For new students, parents must also submit a copy of the child’s Baptism certificate to olqmreled@gmail.com.
