

This Week's Reflection

from the Catholic Teaching Committee

Reflecting on the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope

The document written by Pope Francis to open this 2025 Jubilee Year begins with the words "Hope Does Not Disappoint" (Romans 5:5). In his reflection on hope and patience, the late Holy Father writes that "the first sign of hope should be a desire for peace in our world.... May the Jubilee remind us that those who are peacemakers will be called 'children of God." (Matthew 5:9)

Hope for Parents and Prisoners

Pope Francis links hope with "enthusiasm for life and a readiness to share it.... Openness to life and responsible parenthood is the design that the Creator has implanted in the hearts and bodies of men and women" (9). He encourages us "to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind." He mentioned prisoners "who deprived of their freedom, daily feel the harshness of detention and its restrictions, lack of affection and, in more than a few cases, lack of respect for their persons." A Jesuit priest whose name is Father Zachariah Presutti, S.J., currently serves as Chaplain at Riker's Island and works toward reintegrating former prisoners into the community with a commitment to respect for law.

Hope for the Sick and the Young

The late Holy Father continues: "Signs of hope should also be shown to the sick, at home and in hospital. Their sufferings can be allayed by the closeness and affection of those who visit them.... Gratitude should likewise be shown to all those healthcare workers who...carry out their mission with constant care and concern for the sick and those who are most vulnerable.... Signs of hope are also needed by those who are the very embodiment of hope, namely, the young. Sadly, they often see their dreams and aspirations frustrated. We must not disappoint them, for the future depends on their enthusiasm....The Jubilee should inspire the Church to make greater efforts to reach out to them ...[and] demonstrate care and concern" (11-12).

Hope for Migrants and Refugees

PILGRIM

"Signs of hope should also be present for migrants who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families. Their expectations must not be frustrated by prejudice and rejection. A spirit of welcome, which embraces everyone with respect for his or her dignity, should be accompanied by a sense of responsibility, lest anyone be denied the right to a dignified existence.

"May the Christian community always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable, opening wide its doors to welcome them, lest anyone ever be robbed of the

hope of a better future. May the Lord's words in the great parable of the Last Judgement always find an echo in our hearts: 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me' for 'just as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me' (Mt 25:35.40)" (13).



The Saint of Miracles Among Us

wo holy relics of St. Anthony of Padua visit our church today, accompanied by Fathers Mario Conte and Fabio Turrisendo, two Franciscan friars from the Pontifical Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua, Italy.

The two relics are fragments of St. Anthony's facial skin and his floating rib.

The relic of the floating rib has special significance for the friars of Padua because it was venerated by Lucy of Fatima in her convent in Coimbra in 1995, and by then-Archbishop Jorge Mario Bergoglio (the late Pope Francis) in the Cathedral of Buenos Aires in 2000.

For those seeking this beloved saint's intercession, you may fill out a prayer card and write your personal intentions, which the Franciscan friars will return to the saint's tomb in Padua.

We thank the Antonian Association of Chicago for arranging this relic tour.
