## This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

## The Universal Call to Holiness; the Mysterium Tremens et Fascinans

"You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in You." (St. Augustine)

**REFLECT:** Let's turn to how people have experienced the holy throughout history to see if we can use that to understand what it means to say that God alone is holy. In his spiritual classic *The Idea of the Holy*, philosopher Rudolph Otto articulated the experience we have when we experience God without the scaffolding of doctrine or religious affiliation. In other words, how would someone without a religious education describe experiencing God?

First, he says that the experience is numinous, which he defines as a spiritual experience that we have of something that is outside of ourselves. It's not a good feeling, not a fantasy, not a reflection of my narcissism. In the numinous experience of God, I have no doubt that this is not me, and that this experience is not in my head.

Second, he describes the experience of God as experiencing the *Mysterium Tremens et Fascinans*. Mysterium tremens refers to the experience of God as a mystery that confronts me with its tremendous awe and majesty. We saw that in our earlier reflections on God's transcendence and immanence.

Third, the experience fascinates ("fascinans") and captivates. Recall how Moses, upon encountering God at the burning bush, or the apostles, upon encountering the Trinity at the transfiguration, fall on their knees in fear and awe. This begs the question, then: Why don't they run away? Why instead, as Otto notes, does the experience captivate us?

The answer is surprisingly simple; it is because we are children of God. As the catechism states, "the desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself." Our hearts are restless, St. Augustine discovered, until they rest in our awesome God, who is always calling us to holiness.

## Reconfiguring for the Future: Brooklyn/Queens Diocese Addresses Resource Challenges

Bishop Robert Brennan recently addressed pastors and administrators within the diocese to acknowledge his deanery visits and the gathered suggestions. He also announced the implementation of a Reconfiguration Process for optimizing resources and strengthening parish connections. The text of his letter, dated June 7, 2024, is reproduced here.

Dear Pastors and Administrators,

As you know we are coming up on the conclusion of this year's Deanery visits. Monsignor Joseph Grimaldi, your local Regional Episcopal Vicar and I have listened to your suggestions and concerns, and the conversations have personally been very encouraging to me.

As we look to the new pastoral year, I am committed to implement our Reconfiguration Process, with its three different stages throughout our diocese, in order to effectively utilize our financial and clergy personnel resources. The purpose of the Reconfiguration Process is to strengthen the relationship that already exists among parish communities in particular areas of our diocese and to enhance the varied ministries that each parish offers, while collaborating, partnering or merging with another parish.

Collaboration, partnerships, or parish mergers are taking place in many dioceses and a number of parishes share their pastor with at least one other parish with that number growing. The issues we face here in our diocese, though unique in their own ways, are similar to what is happening throughout the country. We are one family in faith.

With this in mind, pastors in each deanery have been tasked to discuss and adjust their Mass schedules in collaboration with the other parishes in their deanery this coming Fall.

You are also strongly encouraged to work with neighboring parishes outside your assigned deanery, if pastorally necessary. To that effect, I am asking that no Mass intentions be taken after June 30, 2025. It is essential that every parish share in this commitment.

You will hear more about this process in the coming months, and you are encouraged to engage actively in the consultation opportunities at the deanery level. Please provide your thoughts and ideas to your Dean. This is an important moment for new opportunities in our diocese. It is crucial that this process be rooted in prayer and open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I ask that you be faithful to patient discernment and committed to creating a plan with your Parish Leadership, Dean and Regional Vicar that will set the roadmap for the future vitality and vibrancy of all our parishes in Brooklyn and Queens.

Thank you for your cooperation as we embark in this new phase of reconfiguration in our diocese. Be assured of my continued prayers for each of you and parish communities.




