

# The Eucharist: The Fruits of Holy Communion

"Not to go to Communion is like someone dying of thirst beside a spring." St John Vianney

**REFLECT:** Through the Eucharist, we are united more closely with Christ: "The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: 'He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him...."

Through the Eucharist, we are united more closely with Christ's Mystical Body, the Church: "Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body—the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism.... The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren...."

The Eucharist strengthens our charity, cleanses us from past sins, and preserves us from future sin: "The Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins.... For as often as we eat this bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the death of the Lord. If we proclaim the Lord's death, we proclaim the forgiveness of sins.... I should always receive it, so that it may always forgive my sins....

"The Eucharist strengthens our charity, which tends to be weakened in daily life; and this living charity wipes away venial sins. By giving himself to us, Christ revives our love and enables us to break our disordered attachments to creatures and root ourselves in him.... By the same charity that it enkindles in us, the Eucharist preserves us from future mortal sins. The Eucharist is not ordered to the forgiveness of mortal sins—that is proper to the sacrament of Reconciliation." (Catechism)

**ACT:** Receive Holy Communion frequently, and always in a state of grace.

**LEARN:** Read what the Catechism says about the Fruits of the Eucharist, starting with paragraph 1391 (at https://bit.ly/3LXeMVr).

ne Sunday in the spring of 1998, I was minding my own business, sitting in the back pew at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs for Sunday Mass, when an old guy in a plaid jacket tapped me on the shoulder and handed me a wicker basket and whispered, "Hey, can you help with the collection? Thanks."

Well, okay. Soon I was doing it every Sunday. The rest is history.

Now, Siobhain and I are about to write another chapter in that history. In early July, we'll be departing Forest Hills and retiring to Florida (suburban Orlando, to be precise).

I make my living with words, whether in print or in the pulpit, and I've logged tens of thousands of them in my years here. But I wanted today to add two more, to everyone at OLQM: Thank you.

Thank you for all these Sundays. Days

filled with wonder and joy, persistence and hope, music and prayer. Thank you for praying with me and for me. Thank you for the immeasurable privilege of being able to baptize your children, witness your marriages and bring to so many the Body of Christ. Lord, I am not worthy.

Thank you for all the Lenten Fridays when we walked the Way of the Cross together, and the Easter Vigils when I proclaimed that Christ had risen and I looked out to see a church ablaze with the light of a thousand candles—your light, your hope, your love for the faith we share.

Thank you for Palm Sunday processions and St. Patrick's Day dances and all the raffles and Living Rosaries and all those breathtaking moments every Christmas Eve, year after year, when the church is hushed and the lights are dimmed and the story begins again. Once in royal David's city....


Thank you for filling this church with faith—and filling my heart with gratitude.

I often tell deacons on retreat, "Know this: there's a reason God called you when he did, just as there's a reason he called me at a particular moment, in a particular place." But God had things to teach me here—lessons about love and loyalty, about community, about holding on to what we have been given

The road stretches before us. A new adventure awaits. Together, in the words of one of my favorite hymns, let's "ponder anew what the Almighty can do."
