This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Social Teaching

The Family as First School of Prayer

I recall your sincere faith that first lived in your grandmother ... and in your mother ... and that I am confident lives also in you.

(2 Timothy 1:5)

REFLECT: "By reason of their dignity and mission, Christian parents have the specific responsibility of educating their children in prayer, introducing them to gradual discovery of the mystery of God and to personal dialogue with Him: It is particularly in the Christian family ... that from the earliest years children should be taught, according to the faith received in Baptism, to have a knowledge of God, to worship Him and to love their neighbor. The concrete example and living witness of parents is fundamental and irreplaceable in educating their children to pray....

"Family prayer has for its very own object family life itself.... Joys and sorrows, hopes and disappointments, births and birthday celebrations, wedding anniversaries of the parents ... separations and homecomings ... the death of those who are dear, etc.—all of these mark God's loving intervention in the family's history. They should be seen as suitable moments for thanksgiving, for petition, for trusting abandonment of the family into the hands of their common Father in heaven....

"An important purpose of the prayer of [the family] is to serve as the natural introduction for the children to the liturgical prayer of the whole Church, both in the sense of preparing for it and of extending it into personal, family and social life. Hence the need for gradual participation by all the members of the Christian family in the celebration of the Eucharist, especially on Sundays and feast days, and of the other sacraments, particularly the sacraments of Christian initiation of the children.... Only by praying together with their children can a father and mother—exercising their royal priesthood—penetrate the innermost depths of their children's hearts and leave an impression that the future events in their lives will not be able to efface." (Familiaris Consortio)
