This Week's Reflection

from the Catholic Teaching Committee

2025 Jubilee Year Gatherings

Pope Francis designated different weekends during this Jubilee Year to meet with different groups of people. May 31/June 1 was a recent weekend dedicated to families, children, grandparents, and the elderly. The United States Bishops also prepared a resource guide for that gathering, which begins with the following spiritual reflection.

Incarnation of the Word in a Human Family

In celebrating "the Jubilee of Families, Children, Grandparents and the Elderly, set within a yearlong celebration of hope, we remember the words of Pope Francis to families in his exhortation, Amoris Laetitia (AL): "The incarnation of the Word in a human family, in Nazareth, by its very newness changed the history of the world."

"The story of Christ's birth is retold every year to remind us of this long-awaited gift that arrived in the form of a child. Every family experiences a similar moment of untold joy and hope with a child's arrival.

"The joy of love in families is rooted in hope despite the challenges and trials that life presents us. The letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians reminds us that love hopes all things (1 Cor 13:4-7). It does not despair of the future. In fact, every family is a symbol of hope for future generations.

"As Christians, we live in the present moment, fully immersed in the time that is, while fully aware of the time that is coming in which our hopes will be fulfilled. Hope also bids us live fully in the present, giving our all to the life of the family, for the best way to prepare a solid future is to live well in the present' (AL, n. 219)."

The Bishops go on to pray that our journey this year as "pilgrims of hope" "may renew your hope as a family and strengthen your commitment to bear witness to the source of hope within you. May Christ, our Hope bless you and your families!"

The US Bishops go on to offer this prayer.

Prayer for Families

We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own incarnate Son, to become part of a family, so that, as he lived its life, he would experience its worries and its joys.

We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the

Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to your glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thanks to everyone dropping off used-clothing this morning at the St. Vincent de Paul clothing donation truck. May God bless you for your charity!


