

## This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

#### The Universal Call to Holiness: Part 1

"So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:48)

**REFLECT:** The universal call to holiness is the universal call to God, the fount of all holiness, who alone is holy. But what do we mean when we say that God alone is holy? This is an important question, and one surprisingly difficult to answer. The catechism offers little help. While the catechism uses the words "holy" and "holiness" well over a thousand times, it offers no definition of holiness. Then we get this cryptic entry in paragraph 2809 of the catechism: "The holiness of God is the inaccessible center of his eternal mystery."

This mystery shows the limits of our thinking. For example, when we think of God's transcendence, we approach this understanding using human attributes and adding a superlative. We know what it is to be loving or powerful, so we say God is all-loving or all-powerful. But there are two problems with this.

First, as the catechism warns, when reasoning by analogy we have to keep in mind that "between Creator and creature no similitude can be expressed without implying an even greater dissimilitude" (CCC 43). Saying that God is all-loving and all-powerful can only faintly approximate what it means for God to be loving and powerful.

Second, when it comes to holiness, there is no human attribute to start with. Scripture repeatedly notes how when first encountering God, we are struck by our unworthiness, and like Isaiah, we can only cry, "Woe is me; I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Despite our protest, God continues to call us to his unfathomable holiness. Over the next few weeks, we will reflect on what this means and how we are to respond.

# New Program Structure for Religious Education

Even as students and teachers embark on a well-deserved summer break, we are looking ahead and making plans for the fall. Beginning September 2024, the Religious Education Program of our parish will implement a two-year preparation program for First Holy Communion and for Confirmation. The new structure, developed in consultation with Deacon Thomas Jorge, the director of Religious Ed, includes a Pre-Sacrament Class in the first year and a Sacrament Class in the second year. This change will give young learners more time to fully absorb the class teachings, develop their spiritual habits, and better understand the language of their faith, all in preparation for receiving the Sacraments.—Father Passenant
