

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

Teresian Prayer

"Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you." (James 4:8)

REFLECT: Prayer is first and always a response to God. As the Catechism states, "God calls man first.... In prayer, the faithful God's initiative of love always comes first; our own first step is always a response" (CCC 2567). And because we "do not know how to pray as we ought" (Romans 8:26), Jesus teaches us (CCC 2607).

St. Teresa of Jesus illustrates this in saying, "Mental prayer in my opinion is nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us." We are invited into this intimate sharing as friends because Jesus first defined us as friends, stating, "I know longer call you servants but friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15). Jesus shares everything with his Father, and that is the level of intimacy he offers us.

If we do not love Jesus as an intimate friend it is because we haven't reached that degree of conformity with his will. Our will is too scattered, too divided, too torn between different loves. If we want to pray as an intimate friend, we need to transform our will.

Teresa urges us to enter prayer with a quiet mind, turning our attention from all external distractions, from our internal chatter, and stay, as best we can, in the gentle presence of the God who loves us. Be gentle, she warns. Christ is not judging; Christ is offering friendship. That is what the Pascal Mystery is all about. "While we were still sinners," writes Paul (Romans 8:8), Christ proved his love for us by dying for us. He did this because as a friend, he wanted these intimate moments in quiet prayer with us.

ACT: Spend time in quiet prayer with Jesus each day, every day, for at least fifteen minutes.

Catholics age 14 and older should abstain from meat on *ALL* Fridays of Lent. Catholics ages 18 to 59 are obligated to fast on GOOD FRIDAY. Limit yourself to a single full meal and avoid food between meals. All Catholics are expected to fulfill their EASTER DUTY to receive Communion between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday (May 26).
