This Week's Reflection from Catholic Teaching

Holy Saturday with Our Lady of Solitude

And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. (Luke 2:19)

REFLECT: Our Lady of Solitude (Spanish: María de la Soledad) is a title of Blessed Mother, and a special form of Marian devotion commemorating the solitude of Mary on Holy Saturday.

Holy Saturday "is not like other days. It is filled, quite poignantly and uniquely, with solitude and silence, with memory and hope. On Holy Saturday, Our Lady of Solitude stands as a beacon of hope and a tower of strength. With her and with the whole Church, we wait in silence and stillness.

"Today, through the example of Our Blessed Mother, we learn what it means to be guardians of memory. In a trust-filled solitude, Mary pondered in her heart the Word of God, the memory of her Son, the promises and prophesies. In an attentive silence, she dwelt in hope, in a hope that was stronger than death. In this she teaches us how to truly be contemplatives. Flowing from her 'living water' of memory came welling up within her the strength to remain standing at the Foot of the Cross and to remain filled with hope during that first long, painful Holy Saturday. She kept all these things in her heart, pondering them as a Guardian of Memory.

"Through the devastating darkness of Good Friday and the quiet longing of Holy Saturday, Our Lady (the perfect Guardian of Memory) continued to ponder, to contemplate, and to dwell in the security of one who knows the mercy and love of God. She dared to hope when everyone else had extinguished their lamps. And her light was burning brightly when her Son rose from the dead. May it be so with us. Our Lady of Solitude, pray for us and form us into true contemplatives like you." (Our Lady of Solitude Monastery, http://tinyurl.com/ mr35yc93).

ACT: On Holy Saturday, until the Easter Vigil, there is no Mass to attend; the tabernacle stands open and empty. Where are we to pray, if not with our Mother? Set aside some time on Holy Saturday to pray quietly with Mary. Pray the sorrowful mysteries.



The Easter Triduum

Three days (*triduum* in Latin) represent the most sacred time in the Church year and recall events that changed the course of human history.

Holy Thursday celebrates the Last Supper, when Jesus instituted the Eucharist. The rite of foot-washing is performed to recall Jesus washing the feet of his disciples and calling them to follow his example. We pray at the repository all through the night as Jesus asked his disciples to pray with him in the garden of Gethsemane before his arrest.

Good Friday remembers the Lord's Passion, crucifixion, and death. It is the one day of the year when the Church does not celebrate Mass. We observe fasting and abstinence and meditate on the last hours before Christ's death.

Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil. On this night, we reenact the passage from death to life: lighting the Easter (Paschal) candle, recounting the story of our salvation, renewing our baptismal vows. It is also the day when those entering the Catholic Church receive the Sacraments for the first time.
