This Week's Reflection

from the Catholic Teaching Committee

On the Joyful Proclamation of the Gospel

Pope Francis's 2013 apostolic exhortation "The Joy of the Gospel" is our suggested spiritual reading for this 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope.

Pope Francis told us to read Sacred Scripture in a reverential way: "The first step, after calling upon the Holy Spirit in prayer, is to give our entire attention to the biblical text....Whenever we attempt to understand the message of a particular text, we are practicing 'reverence for the truth.' This is the humility of heart which recognizes that . . . 'we are neither masters or owners [of the word], but its guardians, heralds and servants." (146)

On Spiritual Accompaniment

The Holy Father wrote: "One who accompanies others has to realize that each person's situation before God and their life in grace are mysteries which no one can fully know from without. The Gospel tells us to correct others and to help them grow on the basis of a recognition of the objective evil of their actions (cf. Mt 18:15), but without making judgments about their responsibility and culpability (cf. Mt 7:1; Lk 6:37).... Our personal experience of being accompanied and assisted . . . will teach us to be patient and compassionate with others, and to find the right way to gain their trust." (172)

The Spiritual Savor of Being a People

"Sometimes we are tempted to be that kind of Christian who keeps the Lord's wounds at arm's length. Yet Jesus wants us to touch human misery. . . . He hopes that we will stop looking for those personal or communal niches which shelter us from the maelstrom of human misfortune and instead enter into the reality of other people's lives and know the power of tenderness. Whenever we do so . . . we experience what it is to be . . . part of a people." (170)

The Reflection of God's Glory

He goes on: "Every human being is the object of God's infinite tenderness.... If I can help at least one person to have a better life, that already justifies the offering of my life....We achieve fulfillment when we break down walls and our heart is filled with faces and names!... No single act of love for God will be lost, no generous effort is meaningless, no painful endurance is wasted.... It may be that the Lord uses our sacrifices to shower blessings in another part of the world which we will never visit. The Holy Spirit works as he wills, when he wills and where he wills; we entrust ourselves without pretending to

> see striking results. We know only that our commitment is necessary." (273 and 279)

There are many other rich reflections in the exhortation. Pope Francis proposes Mary Our Mother as "Jesus' gift to his people." His prayer to Mary will be our reflection next week. You can find "The Joy of the Gospel" in its entirety on the Vatican website (Vatican.va).

At the end of April, the NY State Assembly passed a bill to legalize physician-assisted suicide. The Senate may vote next. Senate Bill 138 would let doctors prescribe lethal medication to end a patient's life.

Lawmakers need to hear from constituents to reject this dangerous practice. Assisted suicide endangers patients, caregivers, and vulnerable patients, especially the elderly and those with disabilities, and undermines the dignity of life. Suicide is not medical care.
