

This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching

The Pneumatological Vocation of Women: Part One

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said." (John 14:26)

REFLECT: "Again and again, one finds in Scripture," writes Catholic theologian Nina Heereman, vocabulary describing women "that is elsewhere reserved for the description of God.... In particular, women are described with attributes which one would otherwise use to describe the Holy Spirit." One might say, as we find echoed in the writings of Pope St. John Paul II and the early church fathers, that while men and women share an equal dignity and a common vocation to give themselves in love as a gift, that they do this in different ways: men are more Christological; women are more Pneumatological.

This is not to say that women have more of the graces of the Holy Spirit. That would be absurd; God loves all without limit. Rather, since God willed the diversity of sexes, we do well to understand this difference shows in God's plan for salvation. This is surprisingly Trinitarian. We believe that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are equally God; they are consubstantial. But as the catechism states (CCC 258), "While the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one in nature and operation, they still differ in the way they perform the common work of salvation according to their unique personal property."

In Genesis 2, God creates woman as a "helper" for man because of the profound loneliness he has been experiencing up to then. The word "helper" is significant; it is elsewhere used exclusively for God. The catechism puts this with shocking simplicity. "Holy Scripture affirms that man and woman were created for one another.... The woman, 'flesh of his flesh,' his equal, his nearest in all things, is given to him by God as a 'helpmate'; she thus represents God from whom comes our help" (CCC 1605). How women do this will be the content of our next reflection.

ACT: Ask for your mom's blessing this Mother's Day. She "represents God from whom comes our help."
