## **This Week's Reflection** from Catholic Teaching

*Ed. Note: During the two months prior to the national election, the reflections focus on Church teachings on forming consciences for faithful citizenship.*

### **Faithful Citizens and the Primacy of Respecting Life**

“The right to life is the first among human rights.” (*Pope Francis*)

**REFLECT:** In *Evangelium Vitae*, Pope St John Paul II wrote that “whatever is opposed to life itself, such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia, or willful self-destruction, whatever violates the integrity of the human person, . . . whatever insults human dignity, such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children; as well as disgraceful working conditions, where people are treated as mere instruments of gain rather than as free and responsible persons; all these things and others like them are infamies indeed. . . .”

“Unfortunately, this disturbing state of affairs, far from decreasing, is expanding. . . . The end result of this is tragic: not only is the fact of the destruction of so many human lives still to be born or in their final stage extremely grave and disturbing, but no less grave and disturbing is the fact that conscience itself, darkened as it were by such widespread conditioning, is finding it increasingly difficult to distinguish between good and evil in what concerns the basic value of human life.

“Only respect for life can be the foundation and guarantee of the most precious and essential goods of society, such as democracy and peace. There can be no true democracy without a recognition of every person’s dignity. . . . Nor can there be true peace unless life is defended and promoted.”

The US Catholic Bishops state that “our Conference supports laws and policies to protect human life to the maximum degree possible, including constitutional protection for the unborn and legislative efforts to end abortion, assisted suicide, and euthanasia. We also promote a culture of life by supporting laws and programs that encourage childbirth and adoption over abortion and by addressing poverty, providing health care, and offering other assistance to pregnant women, children, and families” (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*).

**ACT:** Prepare for the election by learning where our national and local candidates stand on respect for life issues, such as abortion, euthanasia, and conscience protection.

## Proposal Number One Raises Concerns over Religious Freedom & Parental Rights

Election Day is November 5; New York's early voting dates are October 26 to November 3, 2024.

The Catholic League, a nonprofit of laypersons defending the religious freedom of Catholics, has issued a response to Proposal Number One, which voters in New York State will be asked to vote on this year. This ballot proposal would amend the New York State Constitution and extend equal protection under the law to new demographic categories that the Catholic Church rejects. The Catholic League says that the measure could potentially "undermine parental rights, eviscerate religious freedom, and legalize selective discrimination."

The Catholic League, with the support of Cardinal Dolan and the bishops of New York State, urge you to vote NO on Proposal Number One.
