This Week's Reflection

from Catholic Teaching



St. John Chrysostom on the Blood of Christ Received in Holy Communion

"When you draw near to the awe-inspiring chalice, approach as if you were going to drink from Christ's own side." (St. Saint John Chrysostom)

REFLECT: The church celebrates the feast of Saint John Chrysostom, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, on September 13. He was born in Antioch around 349, ordained a priest in 386, and elected Bishop of Constantinople in 397. He was known for the elegance with which he explained Catholic doctrine. He died in 407 after uttering his last words, "Glory be to God for all things."

He wrote: "Let us then return from the [communion] table like lions breathing fire, having become terrible to the devil; thinking [of our Lord], and on the love which He has shown for us. [Our Lord says,] 'I feed you with My own flesh, desiring that you all be nobly born, and holding forth to you good hopes for the future.... I have willed to become your Brother, for your sake I shared in flesh and blood, and in turn I give out to you the flesh and the blood by which I became your kinsman.'

"This blood causes the image of our King to be fresh within us, produces beauty unspeakable, permits not the nobleness of our souls to waste away, watering it continually, and nourishing it.... This blood, if rightly taken, drives away devils, and keeps them afar off from us, while it calls to us Angels and the Lord of Angels....

"This blood is the salvation of our souls, by this the soul is washed, by this is beautiful, by this is inflamed, this causes our understanding to be more bright than fire, and our soul more beaming than gold; this blood was poured forth, and made heaven accessible.... Let us bear in mind of what things Christ has deemed us worthy, let us give thanks, let us glorify Him." (Homily 46 on the Gospel of John)
