

This Week's Reflection

From the OLQM Social Action Committee

On Civil Discourse During This Election Cycle

"May you be sowers of hope, builders of bridges and agents of dialogue and harmony." (Pope Francis, April 29, 2017)

REFLECT: As Catholics, our strong tradition of social teaching compels us to actively engage in building up our communities. Yet many of us shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with vitriol and harsh language, often directed at people themselves. What is needed is good, honest, civil dialogue. We must treat everyone as worthy of being at the table, worthy of our respect, and worthy of being heard.... Civilize It: Dignity Beyond the Debate invites Catholics to pledge civility, clarity, and compassion in the public square and to call on others to do the same.



Civility: To recognize the human dignity of those with whom I disagree, treat others with respect, and rise above attacks when directed at me.

Clarity: To root my political viewpoints in the Gospel and a wellformed conscience, which involves prayer, conversation, study, and listening. I will stand up for my convictions and speak out when I witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.

Compassion: To encounter others with a tone and posture which affirms that I honor the dignity of others and invites others to do the same. I will presume others' best intentions and listen to their stories with empathy. I will strive to understand before seeking to be understood.

Major Church Repairs 2020 - Parishioner Report #13

Our Lady Queen of Martyrs flourished in 1912 when Catholics here in Forest Hills gathered for the first Sunday Mass at their new parish. They were tested when the first wood-framed chapel was destroyed by fire in 1929. Then, in the midst of the Great Depression, the parish's founding pastor, Father Joseph McLaughlin, with the support of his congregation, launched a plan to construct a new church building and rectory. Those early congregants made gifts and memorials to Father McLaughlin's building fund to create this house of worship we cherish today.

As our 108-year-old parish prepares to celebrate its Parish Feast Day this month of September, we are calling on our faithful parishioners to honor the memory of those early congregants and imitate their sacrifice—in the face of similar economic challenges—and make a gift or memorial to help us finish our major renovation. The improvements being undertaken today will preserve this beautiful church for future generations.

Special Collections

Today we are taking a collection for the **Catholic University of America** in Washington, DC, the only institution of higher education in the country chartered by the Vatican. Thank you for your support for Catholic education, educators, and Catholic school families.

Next weekend (September 12/13) will be the **Holy Land collection**. This collection is usually taken on Good Friday but was moved to September because of the suspension of public Masses during Lent this year. The timing is significant: September 14th is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, when the Catholic Church commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross placed on Mt. Calvary. The Holy Land collection allows the Church to maintain an evangelical presence in the lands where Jesus lived, proclaimed his Gospel, performed miracles, was crucified, and rose from the dead.
