January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, and January 11th is National Human Trafficking Awareness Day.

February 8th is the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Trafficking.

February 8th is also the Feast Day of St Josephine Bakhita. Pope St John Paul II canonized St Bakhita in 2000, said: "Abducted and sold into slavery at the tender age of seven, she suffered much at the hands of cruel masters. But she came to understand the profound truth that God, and not man, is the true Master of every human being, of every human life." She won her freedom and became a Canossian Nuns, dedicating her life to comforting the poor and suffering, and serving as a witness against slavery.

Pope St John Paul II added:

"I invite the whole Church to invoke the intercession of St Bakhita upon all our persecuted and enslaved brothers and sisters."
